## <u> A Word from Pastor Joe</u>

Dear Friends in Christ at the Elijah Kellogg Church,

As I think you know the Council is seeking input from every parishioner about a Five Year Plan. I have addressed the process in my *News and Notes* entry for the last two weeks. But it must be the season for five year planning. Why do I say that? The town of Harpswell is in the process of developing a five year plan and the Curtis Memorial Library in Brunswick is developing a five year plan. I got an email survey about the library plan which asked for my input. Below are some of the questions the library asked followed with questions which might apply to the Kellogg Church or any church.

**The library question:** Do you/your family use Curtis Library, the Library bookmobile, or digital resources? Why or why not? If you visit the library, how often do you visit? Do you have a library card?
