A Message from Pastor Joe

Dear Friends in Christ at the Elijah Kellogg Church,

Given I have said this a number of times I expect you know it. I had something of a career as a professional writer in theater before hearing "the call" and heading off to Bangor Seminary. In the course of that work I met many composers, lyricists and writers of librettos. But among them all, I deeply treasure the fact that I met the late Stephen Sondheim. I recently stumbled across this song from the Sondheim show *Follies* sung by the character Ben. The song is one of my favorites. This is a snippet of that lyric.

The road you didn't take / Hardly comes to mind / Does it? / The door you didn't try Where could it have led? / The choice you didn't make / Never was defined / Was it?

Dreams you didn't dare / Are dead / Were they ever there? / Who said? / I don't remember / I don't remember / At all.

The roads you never take / Go through rocky ground / Don't they? / The choices that you make / Aren't all that grim / The worlds you never see / Still will be around / Won't they?

The Ben I'll never be / Who remembers him?

It is an existential question, is it not? How could our lives have turned out in a different way? Suppose I had not been on vacation in Maine, never met my wife, Bonnie, not moved to Maine, not gone to Seminary? Where would I be now?

While these are interesting questions, in a real sense they distract from reality. So it is with a congregation. A key question for any congregation is one which addresses this reality. "Who are we now, really?"

Only once that question is answered can the congregation move forward and become who that congregation wants to be. There is caveat which comes with the question. "Who are we now?" needs to be asked and answered every single day. These existential questions can be and are pivotal as we explore a five year plan.

And does all that sound like hard work? Yes. Is all that necessary work? Yes.
