Please welcome the Mission Group from Pennsylvania. They are here to camp out in our church this week while volunteering to work in 12 different local organizations (please see schedule on next page). A little about them They are Presbyterians who are part of a country church 5 miles south of Grove City, PA, which was started in 1880. Their size of 155 members betrays the level of activity: they are very mission-minded, have an unusual sense of compassion for their members and others in their larger community, and are active in denominational activities. Their women's organization is the largest and most active of all the 46 churches in their presbytery. Grove City has a formerly Presbyterian-affiliated college, and Slippery Rock, PA (3 miles south of us) is the site of Slippery Rock State University. They are just east of Sharon, PA, and about 25 miles from the Ohio border; in the middle between Pittsburgh and Erie, PA. Please see schedule and sign up to volunteer on our bulletin board!
