Many people will come and say, "Let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, that He may teach us His ways, and we may walk in His paths."

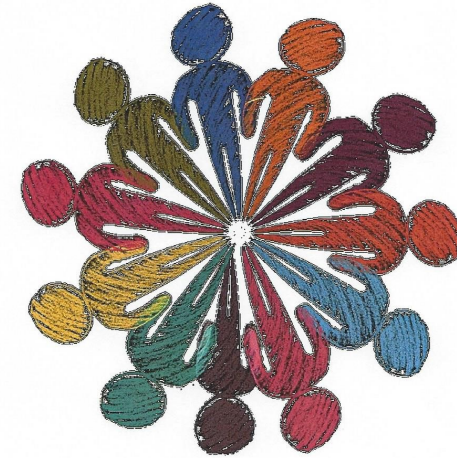
He will judge between the nations,
