Vouchers for Coats for Seniors Now Available

Now that the weather has finally turned cold, Harpswell seniors-in-need may reap the benefits of Maine Association of Area Agencies on Aging "Coats for Seniors" project.

Through the generous donations of Harpswell residents, HAH collected a total of 102 gently used coats and donated them to Goodwill. Liz Bouve said, "As the pick-up-and-deliver gal, I was very impressed with the quantity and quality of the coats. Harpswell folks always come through."

As part of the "Coats for Seniors" program, Goodwill will provide a voucher to an older adult in need of a free winter coat. The vouchers, which are available at the Town Office, allow the senior to go to Goodwill and select his/her own coat. Many older adults are reluctant to ask for a voucher. If you have a neighbor or friend in need of a winter coat, you can collect the voucher for them. If they need a ride, perhaps offer them transportation/company to use the voucher.

New Program -The Communication Connection

To reach older Harpswell adults who don't have access to email, or who use email infrequently, we are launching a new neighborly calling program this month.

An HAH volunteer will make a weekly call to an older resident interested in receiving information on available senior resources and other relevant topics. This is a great opportunity to learn about resources, have questions answered, and meet a new neighbor.


