A landmark, a legacy and responsibility for the future

The congregation of the Elijah Kellogg Church, Congregational is embarking on a three-year campaign to raise \$400,000 to ensure the structural integrity of the 171year-old church. The church's beautiful arched doorway, built by local carpenter Moses Bailey, has served as a gateway, welcoming generations of members and friends as a place of spiritual reflection and renewal. Just as important, its iconic steeple has served as a beacon to generations of fishermen just as the church hall has served as a home for community outreach and Christian fellowship. To continue this work, a capital campaign to raise the necessary funds for renovations and improvements has been organized to address the following priorities:

Exterior

Siding and painting: The corner boards and clapboards are chipping and flaking,

exposing bare wood in many places. Lead-based paint in many areas complicates the restoration work.





The steeple: The wooden frame that houses the church bell is rotted and needs replacement.

Rot: Severe weather has eroded some of the beautiful Moses Bailey woodwork around the door trim and several windowsills.





Windows: Several of the 10 -foot-tall windows in the sanctuary are not weather tight and need major energy efficient repairs both inside and out.

Interior

The basement: Having served as the church's meeting and educational space until the addition of Fellowship Hall was completed in 2000, the basement under the sanctuary is unused and unappealing. Finishing this space would provide for needed additional classroom and community use space.
