#### INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

# A READING FROM THE *TANAKH* IN THE SECTION KNOWN AS THE WRITINGS IN THE PORTION COMMONLY CALLED AS THE PSALMS — Psalm 19 [ILV]

To the leader. A Psalm of David.

The heavens are heralds of the glory of God; the heavens tell of God's eternal glory; and the firmament, the skies proclaim the handiwork, that which God has made.

- [2] Day after day these tell me the story, these pour forth words of God's glory, and night after night these reveal the depth of their understanding and knowledge.
- [3] Without speech, without words; without even an audible voice their cries echo through all the world
- [4] their voice goes out through all the earth, their message reaches to the ends of the world.

In the heavens the sun has pitched a tent.

[5] It comes forth with the grandeur of a wedding procession, with the eagerness of an athlete ready to race it runs its course with joy.

[6] Its rising is from one end of the sky, one end of the heavens,

and it circuits to the other end of the heavens; and nothing escapes its warmth.

[7] Your law, O *Yahweh*, God, is perfect, Your law, O *Yahweh*, God, refreshes the soul;
Your law, Your decrees O *Yahweh*, God, are sure, and are to be trusted.
They make the wise the simple;

they give wisdom to the naïve.

[8] Your purposes, O God, are right; they gladden the heart;
Your commands are clear, giving light to the eyes;
[9] to hold You in awe, O Yahweh, God, is pure and endures forever;
Your decrees O Yahweh, God, are true and steadfast. and righteous, just.
[10] They are more precious than gold, even the purest gold;
sweeter than honey, than drippings of honey fresh from the comb.

- [11] Moreover in them Your people find instruction; there is great reward in keeping them.
- [12] But who can detect one's own failings? So, forgive me from my faults, my misdeeds about which I do not even know.
- [13] Keep back Your faithful one from being insolent, from presumption, so that my faults never control me.

  Then I shall be blameless, and innocent of a grave error.
- [14] And, indeed, may the words of my mouth and the thoughts, the meditations, of my heart be acceptable, pleasing in Your sight, O *Yahweh*, God, my rock and my redeemer!

#### INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

#### A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Matthew 22:1-14 [ILV]

[1] Once more Jesus spoke to them [that is: the Chief Priests and the Pharisees] in parables, saying: [2] "The Dominion of Heaven is like this: it may be compared to a ruler who gave a wedding banquet for an heir. [3] This ruler sent out workers, telling them to summon the invited guests to the wedding banquet; but they would not come. [4] Again, other workers were sent out to say to those invited, 'A feast has been prepared for you. The oxen and fattened calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' [5] But they made light of it, took no notice and went away; one went to farm, another to business, [6] while the rest seized those who had been sent—the workers— attacked them brutally and killed them. [7] The ruler was enraged, furious and dispatched troops, destroyed those murderers and burned their town.

- [8] The ruler then said to the workers, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy; they did not deserve the honor. [9] Go, therefore, into the streets and the crossroads and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' [10] They went out into the streets, the crossroads and gathered everyone they met, good and bad alike, until the wedding hall was filled with guests."
- [11] "Now, the ruler then came into the banquet hall, saw the guests at the tables and noticed one guest who was not wearing a wedding robe. [12] 'My friend,' said the ruler, 'how did you get in here without a wedding garment?' But the guest was speechless, silent. [13] Then the ruler said to the attendants, 'Let this guest be bound hand and foot, and throw this individual out into the outer regions, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' [14] Many are called, but few are chosen."


