INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE EPISTLES — Philippians 3:4b-14 [ILV]

[4b] If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, to place their trust in external evidence, I have more! [5] I was circumcised on the eighth day, being a member of the people of Israel and the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrew origins; as to the law, the legal observances, I was a Pharisee [6] and so zealous I persecuted the church. I was above reproach when it came to justice based on the Law— blameless.

[7] Yet whatever I used to consider gain, I have come to regard as loss because of the Christ. [8] More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ, Jesus, my Savior, for Whose sake I have forfeited all things. I regard everything else as rubbish, so that Christ may be my wealth— [9] indeed, that I may be found in Christ, not having any justice of my own based on observance of the Law. The justice I possess is that which comes through the faith of Christ. It has its origin in God and is based on faith. [10] All I want is to know Christ and the power of the resurrection of Christ and how to share in the suffering of Christ, by being formed into the pattern of the death of Christ— [11] perhaps even to arrive at the resurrection from the dead.

[12] Not that I have already reached this yet or have already finished my course; but I press on to make it my own, because I have been claimed by Christ, Jesus. [13] Beloved— sisters and brothers— I do not consider that I have made it my own, or think of myself as having reached the finish line. But this one thing I do— forgetting what lies behind I strain forward to what lies ahead. [14] I press on toward the goal. My entire attention is focused on the finish line as I run toward the prize— the high calling of God in Christ, Jesus.

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Matthew 21:33-46 [ILV]

[33] {Jesus said to the chief priests, the elders of the people, the religious authorities who had gathered:} "Listen to [this] parable. There was a property owner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a watchtower. Then the owner leased it to tenants and went on a journey to another country. [34] When the harvest time arrived, the owner sent aids to the tenants to divide the shares of the grapes. [35] But the tenants responded by seizing them. They beat one, killed another and stoned a third. [36] Again the landowner sent even more aids, more than the first time. But they

were treated in the same way. [37] Finally the owner sent a family heir to them, thinking, 'They will respect my child.' [38] But when the vine growers saw the owner's child, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir who stands in the way of our having everything; come, let us kill this one too and get the inheritance.' [39] With that, they seized the heir, placed this loved one of the owner outside of the vineyard and committed murder."

[40] "Now," asked Jesus, "when the owner of the vineyard comes, what do you suppose will be done to those tenants?"

[41] Those who heard the parable said, "The owner will put those wretches to a miserable death, and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give the proprietor the grapes at the time the harvest comes."

[42] Jesus said to them, "Have you ever read in the scriptures:

'The stone that the builders rejected

has become the chief cornerstone;

this was our God's doing,

and we find it amazing to behold'?

[43] Therefore I tell you, the dominion of God will be taken away from you and given to a people who will bear its fruits.

[44] Those who fall on this stone will be broken to pieces; and it will crush anyone on whom it falls."

[45] When the chief priests, the elders of the people, the religious authorities heard these parables, they realized Jesus was speaking about them. [46] They wanted to arrest the Rabbi, but they feared the crowds who regarded Jesus as a prophet.

This is the Gospel of Jesus, Who is the Christ.

Women's Fellowship will hold its next craft group at Ruth Smith's home on Tuesday, October 10th from 9:00 to 12:00.


