INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE *TANAKH* IN THE SECTION KNOWN AS THE PROPHETS — Joshua 24:1-3a, 14-25 [ILV]

[1] ...Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel at Shechem and summoned the elders, the leaders, the judges, and the officers of Israel. Once they presented themselves before God [2] Joshua said to the whole assembly, "This is the Word of *Yahweh*, the God of Israel:"

"Long ago your ancestors, including Terah the father of Abraham and Nahor, lived beyond the Euphrates, served and worshiped other gods. [3a] Then I took your ancestors Abraham and Sarah from beyond that river and led them through the entire region of Canaan. I made the descendants of Sarah and Abraham numerous."

[14] ...Joshua said: "I now call upon you to revere, to serve *Yahweh* completely and with sincerity and faithfulness. Put away, cast off the gods that your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates and in Egypt and serve and worship *Yahweh*, God, alone. [15] Now, if you are unwilling to serve God, if you do not want to worship *Yahweh*, choose on this day, make a decision about whom you will worship, whether it will be the gods your ancestors served and worshiped in the region beyond the Euphrates or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are dwelling. But as for me and my household, we will serve *Yahweh*, we will worship *Yahweh* Who is our God."

[16] Then the people answered, "Far be it from us that we should abandon *Yahweh* to serve other gods. It was *Yahweh*, our God, Who brought us and our ancestors out from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. It was *Yahweh*, our God, Who performed those great signs in our sight. It was *Yahweh*, our God, Who protected us along the way, along the entire journey and among all the peoples, through all the lands we passed. It was *Yahweh*, our God, Who drove out before us the Amorites and all the people dwelling in those lands. Therefore we also will serve *Yahweh*, Who is our God."

[19] But Joshua said to the people, "You will not be able to serve *Yahweh*. *Yahweh* is a God most holy. *Yahweh* is a jealous God. *Yahweh* is a God Who will not forgive your transgressions. [20] If you desert *Yahweh* and serve foreign gods, after all that *Yahweh* has done for you, then you will bring disasters— fatal ones— upon yourselves."

[21] And the people protested to Joshua, "No! We will serve Yahweh!"

[22] Then Joshua said to the people, "You are your own witnesses against yourselves. You have chosen *Yahweh*. You have chosen to serve God."

And the people said, "Yes. We are witnesses."

[23] Joshua replied, "Now then, throw away the foreign gods among you and turn your hearts toward *Yahweh*, the God of Israel."

[24] The assembly then said to Joshua, "We will serve and obey Yahweh, our God."

[25] So on that day, Joshua ratified the covenant with the people and drew up statutes and ordinances for them at Shechem, which were recorded in the book of the Law.

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Matthew 25:1-13 [ILV]

{Jesus said} "... the dominion of heaven will be like this. Ten attendants took their lamps and went to meet the wedding party. [2] Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. [3] When the foolish ones took their lamps, they took no oil with them; [4] but the wise ones took flasks of oil with their lamps, enough oil to keep their lamps burning. [5] However, the wedding party was delayed, and all of them became drowsy and fell asleep waiting."

[6] "At midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here comes the wedding party! Come! Let us go out to meet them.' [7] Then all the attendants got up and trimmed their lamps. [8] The foolish ones said to the wise ones, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' [9] But the wise ones replied, 'No! There will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.'"

[10] "And while the foolish ones went to buy more oil, the wedding party arrived, and those who were ready went into the wedding banquet with them; and the door was shut. [11] Later, when the foolish attendants returned, they pleaded to be let in. [12] But the doorkeeper replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' [13] And Jesus then said, 'Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."


Fellowship Hour




