INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE EPISTLES — 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 [ILV]

[1] Now concerning the times and the seasons, specific eras—brothers and sisters, you do not need me to tell you anything or to write anything to you. [2] For you yourselves know very well that the day of God will come like a thief in the night. [3] When people are saying, "At last we have peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them with the abruptness of labor pains and there will be no escape!

[4] But you, beloved sisters and brothers, are not in the night. The Day of God will not catch you like a thief— [5] no!— you are all children of light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or the shadows. [6] So then, let us not fall asleep as others do. Let us keep awake and be sober! [7] Those who sleep, do so at night, and those who get drunk do so at night. [8] But we belong to the day. So, let us be sober. Let us put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for our helmet, the hope of salvation.

[9] God has destined us not to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Savior Jesus, the Christ, [10] who died so that, whether awake or asleep we might live together with Christ. [11] Therefore, encourage one another and build up each other, as, indeed, you are already doing.

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Matthew 25:14-28 [ILV]

{Jesus said: "...the Dominion of Heaven} is as if a wealthy landowner, going on a journey, summoned in three workers and entrusted some property, some funds to them. [15] To the first one was given five talents, to another two talents, to another worker was given one talent, according to each one's ability. Then the landowner went away. [16] Immediately, the worker who had received five talents went off and traded with them and made five more talents. [17] In a similar way, the one who had the two talents made two more. [18] But the one who had received one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried the money of the landowner."

[19] "After a long time the landowner returned from traveling and settled accounts with the workers. [20] The one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing

the additional five saying, 'Master, you entrusted me with five talents and see, I bring five more.'"

[21] "The landowner said, 'Well done! You are a good and trustworthy worker. Since you are dependable in a small matter, I will put you in charge of larger affairs. Come! Share my joy."

[22] "And the one who had received two talents then stepped forward, saying, 'You entrusted me with two talents; here are two more.""

[23] "The landowner said to this one: 'Cleverly done! You too are a good and faithful worker. Since you are dependable in a small matter, I will put you in charge of larger affairs. Come! Share my joy.'"

[24] "Finally, the worker who had received one talent also came forward and said to the landowner, 'Knowing your ruthlessness— you reap where you did not sow and gather where you did not scatter seed— [25] and fearing your wrath, I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here have what is yours. Take back your talent."

[26] "But the landowner replied, 'You worthless and lazy lout! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? [27] All the more reason to have deposited my money with the bankers so that on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. [28] So, take the talent away from this bum, and give it to the one with the ten talents."

Dear Friends,

After worship service Sunday we will gather in Fellowship Hall to enjoy a delicious brunch, prepared in honor of the church's members and friends who support us through their financial gifts and volunteerism. Stewardship breakfast (this year a brunch) has always been a beloved recognition of the generosity that sustains all the good work of the church. This year, at the behest of the Church Council, we are piggybacking that event with a brainstorming session to help the Council develop a five-year plan. These will be guided discussions whose purpose is to elicit ideas from everyone on where we'd like to see the church in 2028. We've had casual conversations with individual church members in the last couple of months; these small group discussions are the follow-up. Council members will take notes at the discussions and bring back the information to the Council to consider next steps.

Here are the questions we're using to frame the discussion. There are no right or wrong answers!

And if you can't make it Sunday, please feel free to give your answers to these questions to any member of the Council.

Five-year plan

Overarching idea: When you envision this church community in 2028, what do you see? What is different, the same? What would you emphasize, what would you minimize?

- 1. What do you think are the top three priorities for this church to attain by 2028? Why?
- 2. How do you see staffing over the next several years? We are pursuing a full-time, settled minister. We currently have a 20-hour per week administrative assistant, a part-time bookkeeper and an accompanist. Our Christian Ed and Music Director positions are vacant. Should we leave it at that? Is there a better way to align our staffing?
- 3. Several people said they want to see an increase in community outreach by the church. What does that look like? Extending ourselves to offer more companionship/services to Harpswell's aging population? Becoming more of a community hub by opening our facility to more organizations affordably? Inserting ourselves into community activities in an intentional way (EKC booths at Harpswell Days, Garden Club festival, Memorial Day parade tours, summer tours of the church in conjunction with Harpswell Historical Society hours?)
- 4. Where should we be from a technology perspective in five years? Live, streaming services; adequate internet speeds and service to Zoom meetings; a robust website that announces all our activities and serves as an ambassador to the world outside our Sunday services?
- 5. Finances: How do we stabilize/grow our financial foundation so we can do all that we propose? Currently, pledges make up about 65% of our budget with the remainder coming from events, endowment gains, rentals, etc. Are there untapped sources (making our kitchen/event assets plates, silverware, coffee urns, tables, chairs, tents available to rent?) Can we commit to legacy giving as a congregation?
- 6. Other ideas?

Please join members of the Church Council on Sunday, Nov. 19, for small-group discussions about our five-year plan. The conversations will commence after a stewardship brunch to celebrate the on-going support of EKC members and friends. Please join us to enjoy a fabulous meal and then brainstorm about how we see EKC in 2028.
