INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE EPISTLES — Ephesians 1:15-23 [ILV]

[15] From the time I first heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love toward all the holy ones— this... this is the reason [16] I have never ceased to give thanks, never stopped thanking God for you, as I remember you in my prayers. [17] I pray that the glorious God of our Savior Jesus, the Christ, will give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation to bring you to a rich knowledge of the Creator.

[18] I pray that God will enlighten the eyes of your mind and the eyes of your heart and that you can see the hope which this call holds for you— the promised glories that the holy ones of God will inherit, [19] and what is the immeasurable greatness, the infinitely great power that is exercised for those of us who believe. You can tell this from the strength of the power of God at work in Jesus, [20] the power used when God raised Christ from the dead to seat Christ in heaven at the right hand of God, [21] far above every ruler, every sovereign, every authority, every power, every dominion, and above every name that can be named— not only in this age but also in the age to come. [22] God has put all things under the feet of Christ and has made Christ the head over all things and the head of the church, [23] which is the body of Christ— indeed, this is the fullness of the One who fills all creation.

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Matthew 25:31-46 [ILV]

{Jesus said} "At the appointed time the Promised One will come in glory, escorted by all the angels of heaven and will sit on the throne of glory. [32] All the nations will be gathered there and the Promised One will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. [33] The sheep will be placed on the right hand and the goats on the left."

[34] "Then the ruler will say to those on the right, 'Come, you, blessed by my *Abba*, God! Inherit the dominion prepared for you from the creation of the world! [35] For I was hungry and you fed me; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and

you welcomed me; [36] I was naked and you gave me clothing; I was ill and you took care of me; I was in prison and you came to visit me.' [37] Then these, who think themselves just will ask, 'When did we see you hungry and feed you? And when did we see you thirsty and give you drink? [38] And when did we see you as a stranger and invite you in? And when did we see you naked and give you clothing? [39] And when did we see you sick or imprisoned and visit you?'''

[40] "And the ruler answered, 'The truth is, every time you did this for the least of these who are members of my family, my brothers and sisters, you did it for me.""

[41] "Then the ruler will say to those on the left, 'Out of my sight you accursed ones! Into the everlasting fire prepared for the Devil and the fallen angels! [42] I was hungry and you gave me no food; I was thirsty and you gave me no drink; [43] I was a stranger and you gave me no welcome; I was naked and you gave me no clothing; I was ill or imprisoned and you did not visit me.""

[44] "They then in turn will ask, 'When was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' [45] The answer will come, 'The truth is, as often as you neglected to do this for one of the least of these, you neglected to do it for me.' [46] And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the just will go off to eternal life."
