Call to Worship — The Lighting of the Advent Candle

A Canticle to the tune of HESPERUS

O God of Hope, to You we pray; In You we place our trust this day. Be now our guide, show us Your light. And lead us through the deepest night.

- ONE: Today is the First Sunday in Advent. Advent marks a time of waiting and preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus, a time we are reminded the birth we celebrate represents the hope God sees, a time for us to walk in the light of God.
- ALL: Today, as we light the first candle, let us allow the flickering flame to remind us that our hope is lived out in prayer and in action, in worship and in work.

We remember too, that on the night of betrayal, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to the disciples saying: "This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, Jesus took the cup, saying: "This is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it in remembrance of me."

Consecrate, therefore, by Your Holy Spirit, O God, these gifts, and bless us that, as we receive them, we may be united with Christ and one another, and continue to be faithful in all things. Amen.

Through the broken bread we participate in the body of Christ. And through the cup of blessing we participate in the new life Christ gives.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Let us now pray, as the saints who have witnessed to us and preceded us throughout the ages have prayed by reciting *The Lord's Prayer*...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

(Note: when the elements are distributed it is suggested you partake of the bread when it is received. This is a symbol of our freedom. It is suggested we partake the cup together as a symbol of our unity.)

These are the gifts of God for the people of God; take them in remembrance that Christ died and was raised for you.

THANKSGIVING

We thank you God, for inviting us to this table where we have known the presence of Christ and have received all Christ's gifts. Strengthen our faith, increase our love for one another, and let us show forth Your presence in our lives. We pray these things in the name of Jesus, the Christ. Amen.

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE EPISTLES — 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 [ILV]

[3] Grace to you and peace from our loving God and from our Savior, Jesus, the Christ.

[4] I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, [5] for in every way you have been richly endowed in Christ, in speech and in knowledge of every kind. [6] In the same way, the testimony about Christ has been strengthened and so confirmed among you [7] that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Savior Jesus, the Christ. [8] God will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Savior Jesus, the Christ. [9] God is faithful; by God you were called into the fellowship of the Child of God, Jesus, Who is the Christ, into intimacy with Jesus, the Christ, Who is our Savior.

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Mark 13:24-37 [ILV]

[24] {Jesus said:} "But in those days,

after that time of distress,

the sun will be darkened,

and the moon will not give its light,

[25] and the stars

will fall from sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

[26] Then they will see 'the Promised One coming in clouds' with great power and glory. [27] Angels will be sent and gather the chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven."

[28] "Take the fig tree as a parable; learn its lesson: as soon as its branch grows supple and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. [29] So in the same way, when you see these things happening, you know that the Promised One is near, at the very gates. [30] Truly I tell you, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. [31] Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away."

[32] "But as for the day or hour nobody knows it— neither the angels of heaven, nor the Only Begotten One— no one but *Abba*, God knows it. [33] So, be constantly on the watch! Beware! Keep alert! Stay awake! You do not know when the appointed time will come.

[34] It is like people going on a journey, traveling abroad. When they leave their home and put their workers in charge, each has a certain task. And those with orders to watch at the front gate, the doorkeepers, need to stay on alert. [35] Therefore, keep awake! You do not know when the owner of the house will come— whether dusk or at midnight or when the cock crows or at early dawn. [36] Do no let the owner suddenly come and catch you asleep. [37] What I say to you I say to all: stay alert! Keep awake!"


