INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE *TANAKH* IN THE SECTION KNOWN AS THE *TORAH* — Genesis 9:8-17 — from a translation by Everett Fox

- [8] Then God said to Noah and to Noah's family, [9] "As for me—here—I am about to establish my covenant with you and your descendants after you, [10] and with all living creatures that are with you: the fowl, the herd animals, and the wildlife of the earth with you; all those that came out of the ark, all the living things of the earth. [11] I hereby establish this, my covenant, with you: all living things shall never again be cut off by the waters of a deluge, and never again shall there be a deluge to bring the earth to ruin."
- [12] God said, "Here is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for ageless generations: [13] I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. [14] This shall be: when I bring clouds over the earth and my bow is seen in the clouds, [15] I will call to mind my covenant that is between me and you and all living beings— all flesh; never again shall the waters become a deluge to bring all flesh to ruin. [16] When my bow is in the clouds, I will look at it and call to mind the everlasting covenant between God and all living beings— all flesh that is on the earth." [17] God then said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is upon the earth."

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Mark 1:1-15 [ILV]

[1] Here begins the Gospel, the good news of Jesus, the Christ, Child of God. [2] As it is written in the prophet Isaiah:

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; [3] a herald's voice in the desert, the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare, make ready the way of our God, Clear a straight path.'"

- [4] And so, John, the Baptizer, appeared in the desert, in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. [5] And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to John, and were baptized in the river Jordan, as they confessed their sins. [6] Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around the waist and ate nothing but grasshoppers and wild honey.
- [7] In the course of preaching John proclaimed, "One more powerful than I is coming after me, the thong of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. [8] I have baptized with water; but that one will baptize with the Holy Spirit."
- [9] And in those days Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. [10] Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, the heavens opened up, were torn apart. The Spirit descended to Jesus like a dove. [11] Then a voice came from the heavens, "You are my Beloved, my Own. On you my favor rests."
- [12] The Spirit immediately drove Jesus out into the wilderness. [13] Jesus was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan, was with the wild beasts and was looked after, tended to, by angels.
- [14] Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the good news of God [15] saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the dominion of God has come near, the reign of God is at hand. Change your minds and believe this good news."


