#### INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

#### A READING FROM THE EPISTLES — Ephesians 2:1-10 [ILV]

- [1] You were dead through the trespasses and transgressions [2] in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. [3] All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else.
- [4] But God, Who is rich in mercy— out of the great love with which God loved us [5] even when we were dead through our trespasses— made us alive together with Christ— by grace you have been saved— [6] and God raised us up with Christ and seated us with Christ in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, [7] so that in the ages to come God might show the immeasurable riches of grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. [8] For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— [9] not the result of works, so that no one may boast. #### A READING FROM GOSPELS — John 3:14-21 [ILV]

- [14] "...just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Human One be lifted up, [15] that whoever believes in that One may have eternal life."

## **Annual Meeting Summary - CORRECTIONS**

There were two (2) errors in the information about the Annual Meeting in last week's News & Notes: 1) Chris Braley's name was misspelled; and 2) the Church kitchen floor replacement, at an estimated cost of \$21,503, was withdrawn from consideration and was NOT approved. As a result, the approved 2024 capital budget is \$85,832. (\$41,000 is reimbursable from a Department of Homeland Security (DHS) grant.)

The errors were in the information provided to the Church office. We apologize for the misinformation."
