A READING FROM THE GOSPELS — Luke 14:1-14 [ILV]

- [1] One Sabbath, when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal, the guests were watching closely.
- [2] Just then, directly in front of Jesus, there was a person who suffered from edema. [3] Jesus asked the experts on the law and Pharisees, "Is it lawful to heal people on the Sabbath, or not?" [4] But they kept silent. With that, Jesus laid hands on this individual, healed the swelling, then sent the person away.
- [5] Jesus said to the guests, "If one of you has a child— or an ox that falls into a pit— will you not immediately rescue that child or that ox, even on a Sabbath day?" [6] They had no answer to this.
- [7] Noticing how the guests were trying to get a place of honor at the banquet table, Jesus then addressed a parable to them.
- [8] "When you are invited by someone to a wedding party, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host. [9] Otherwise the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Make room for this person.' And then you would have to proceed with shame showing on your face to take the lowliest place. [10] What you should do is go and sit down in the lowest place, so that when your hosts approach they will say to you, 'My friend, come up to a more exalted seat.' This will win you the esteem of all the other guests who sit at the table with you. [11] For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."
- [12] Then Jesus said to the host, "When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your colleagues or your relatives or wealthy neighbors. They may invite you in return and thus repay you. [13] No, when you have a reception of some sort, invite those who are poor or those who have physical infirmities or those who cannot see. [14] And you should be pleased that they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."
