

History

The first Meeting House in Harpswell Center, completed in 1759 and the oldest extant in Maine, was the original gathering place for what is now the Elijah Kellogg Church. The church's current building was dedicated in the fall of 1843.

The Reverend Elijah Kellogg was called as minister the following year and served until his death in 1901.

The church was renamed in his honor in 1930.

The Elijah Kellogg Church has been an integral part of the culture and landscape of Harpswell for generations.

Situated in the heart of town, the church has stood, and continues to stand, as a beacon to the town's citizens and visitors, providing a place for worship, service and community gatherings.

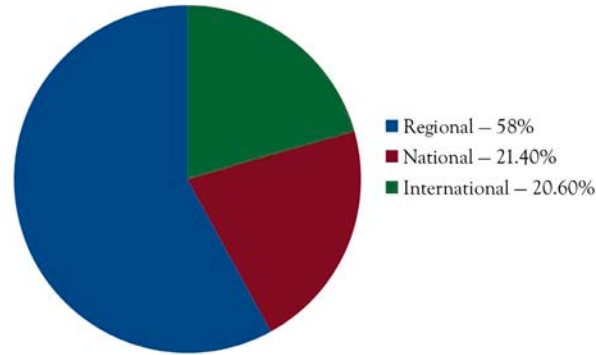
